Job Interview Strategies

You've probably heard your parents talk about the importance of making a good first impression on a job interview (their "dress for success" talk may sound like a lecture, but in this case parents are right).

Here are strategies to help you ace your job interview:

Dress the part. Even if the job you're applying for involves wearing a uniform or working behind the scenes, the way you dress for an interview tells your potential employer that you take the job seriously. If you're a guy, wear a nice pair of pants and a shirt (a tie usually isn't necessary for a summer job, although it doesn't hurt to wear one!). Sneakers, sandals, shorts, t-shirts, sweatshirts, and jeans don't make good interview attire. The same goes for girls — wear something simple and avoid short skirts or skimpy tops.

1. **Appear confident.** Look your potential employer in the eye, shake his or her hand, and remember another parental mantra: good manners. Of course, appearing confident is easiest when you know what you're talking about, and that brings us to the next point.
2. **Be prepared.** Find out what you can about the position or company in advance and show your knowledge during the interview. Researching the company shows the interviewer that you're smart and eager to learn. Doing your research also lets you learn what inspires you about the company so you can share your enthusiasm with the interviewer. If you can, find out more about the position itself. Looking on the company's website or talking to someone who has worked there allows you to think in advance about which skills you have that fit well with the job.
3. **Answer (and ask!) questions.** You'll no doubt be asked typical interview questions, such as why you're interested in the position, what types of skills you offer, and the hours you're available to work. Prepare your answers before the interview. Don't be afraid to ask questions. Questions don't make you look stupid. Asking good questions shows the interviewer you're thoughtful and that you're not afraid to interact with other people — a particularly good interview strategy if the position involves dealing with people, such as sales. If you can, practice being interviewed by an adult in business. When the real time comes, you'll be more prepared and comfortable.
4. **Follow up.** Send the interviewer a brief email or letter thanking him or her for spending time with you. Say how interested you are in the position. This is a particularly good strategy if you're interviewing for an internship or office position. Your future employer will be impressed by your determination.

Parents or older siblings can offer good advice about job hunting and interviewing. So don't hesitate to ask for help on everything from putting together your résumé to choosing an interview outfit. Chances are, you'll be interviewing with and working for people their age anyway so a little insight can't hurt.

Qualities of a Successful Teen Candidate

1. **Well groomed**
clean, neat and ironed clothing
(Tongue and nose rings are still frowned upon in many places)
2. **Good oral and written communication skills**
Speak clearly with proper grammar
(Save the slang for social occasions)
Write clearly with proper spelling and grammar
3. **Neat, thorough and complete application**
4. **Basic math, reasoning and reading comprehension skills**
Ability to add, subtract, multiply and divide
Ability to read and understand written instructions
5. **Ambition**
6. **Courtesy**
7. **Trustworthiness**
8. **Self-motivation**
9. **Willingness to learn**
10. **Reliable**

Developing and demonstrating the “soft” skills below, will also help you land a job. Today's employers want workers to have the following skills:

- **Organization**— the ability to manage time efficiently and maintain an orderly, neat or clean work area.
- **Problem Solving**— the ability to identify, analyze and solve problems that may arise.
- **Teamwork** —the ability to work successfully with others and for the good of the employer.

Helpful Hints: Applying for Summer Opportunities

Submitting an application

1. When applying for jobs, internships or volunteer activities have a resume. A resume should include your name, address and contact information. It should also include any activities you're involved in, any employment or volunteer experience you've had and a brief description of each. A resume example follows.
2. A co-curricular resume can also be important. It is an easy way to organize your experience in a format that can supplement your application for internships, volunteer opportunities, camps and summer jobs. It's important to show your involvement in arts, sports clubs and internships outside of school; they're a way to show a prospective employer additional qualities about yourself. It is important to note any accomplishments and award recognition. There are many transferable skills that are learned from participating in co-curricular activities. Examples: time management, achieving goals, consensus building, assertiveness, leadership, decision making
3. Have your drivers' license and your social security number on hand; many organizations use these documents for identification. With the application include a brief introductory cover letter about why you want to work and/or volunteer at this organization and what your qualifications are for this position. Submit your cover letter, resume, and list of references, too.
4. Be mindful that employers will contact you via email or voicemail. Make sure your screen name and voicemail message is not objectionable. Promptly return all calls or messages. Do so in a quiet location where there are not a lot of distractions.

Collecting References

1. A reference is an adult over 25 not related to you. It should be someone who has known you for at least one year and will let a prospective employer know you are a responsible and person young adult.
2. Reliable references would include a teacher, coach, counselor, volunteer supervisor, manager at a recent job or family friend.
3. Obtain permission from prospective references before giving out their name and contact information. Ask how they would like to be contacted and indicate this on your references page.
4. Your reference sheet should include the following information:
 - Name of Person
 - Title of Person
 - Mailing Address
 - Telephone Number with Area Code
 - E-Mail address
 - Years acquainted & How

Interview

1. Be on time. Dress neatly and appropriately: cover tattoos and remove most piercings. Silence your cell phone or pager.
2. Prepare to be asked:
 - Why do you want to work here
 - When are you available to start work/any known vacations
 - What hours/days are you available to work
 - What pay are you looking for
 - What do you like to do/what interests you
 - What was your prior job experience
 - Are you looking for only a summer job
3. Plan to ask
 - What are the job responsibilities
 - What are the hours and pay
 - Do you have to wear a uniform or what is the required dress code
 - What opportunities are there for advancement
 - What training is provided
4. After the interview, send a thank you note. An email thank you is acceptable; a hand-written or typed note is better.

Final Thoughts

If you are offered a position, respond in a timely manner about your intention. If you choose not to take the position, call or send a note thanking the organization for this opportunity.

Minimum wage is recalculated yearly based on a cost-of-living adjustment for workers 16 and older. 14-15 year olds may be paid 85% of the minimum wage (\$7.27 per hour).
- If a minor student is working during the school year, a parent/school authorization form is required. Employers are responsible for ensuring the form has been completed.
