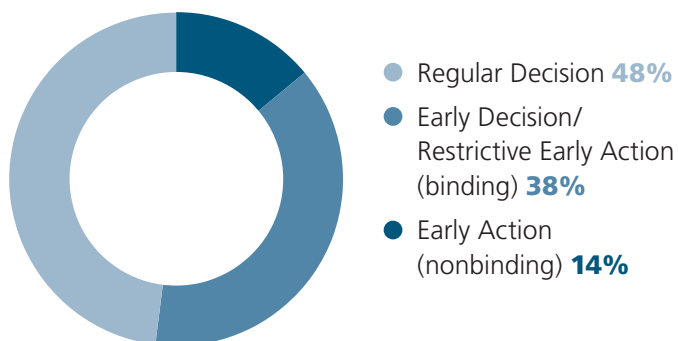

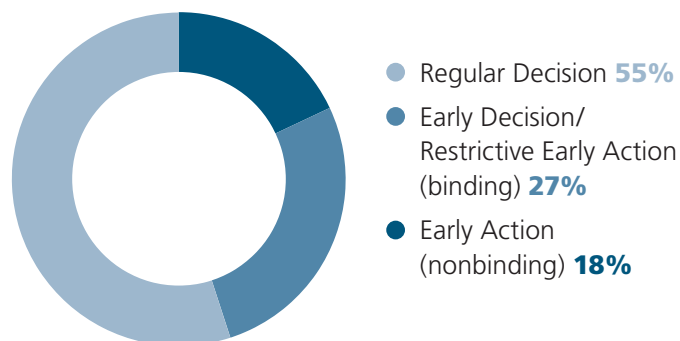

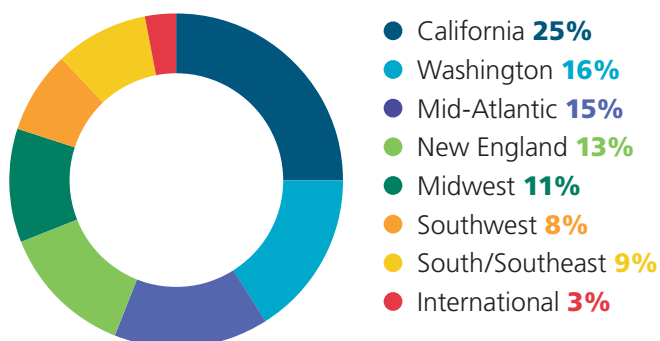
MATRICULATION BY APPLICATION TYPE 2020



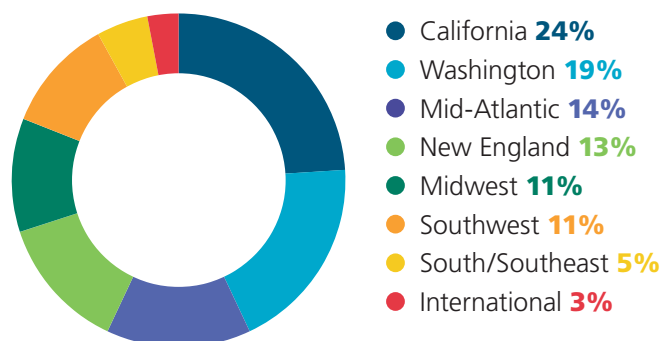
MATRICULATION BY APPLICATION TYPE 2019



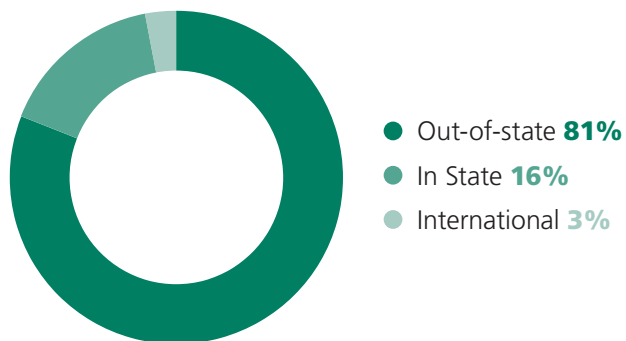
ENROLLMENT BY GEOGRAPHIC REGION 2020



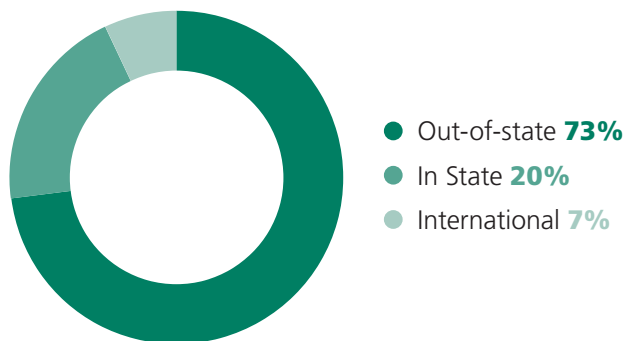
ENROLLMENT BY GEOGRAPHIC REGION 2016–2020



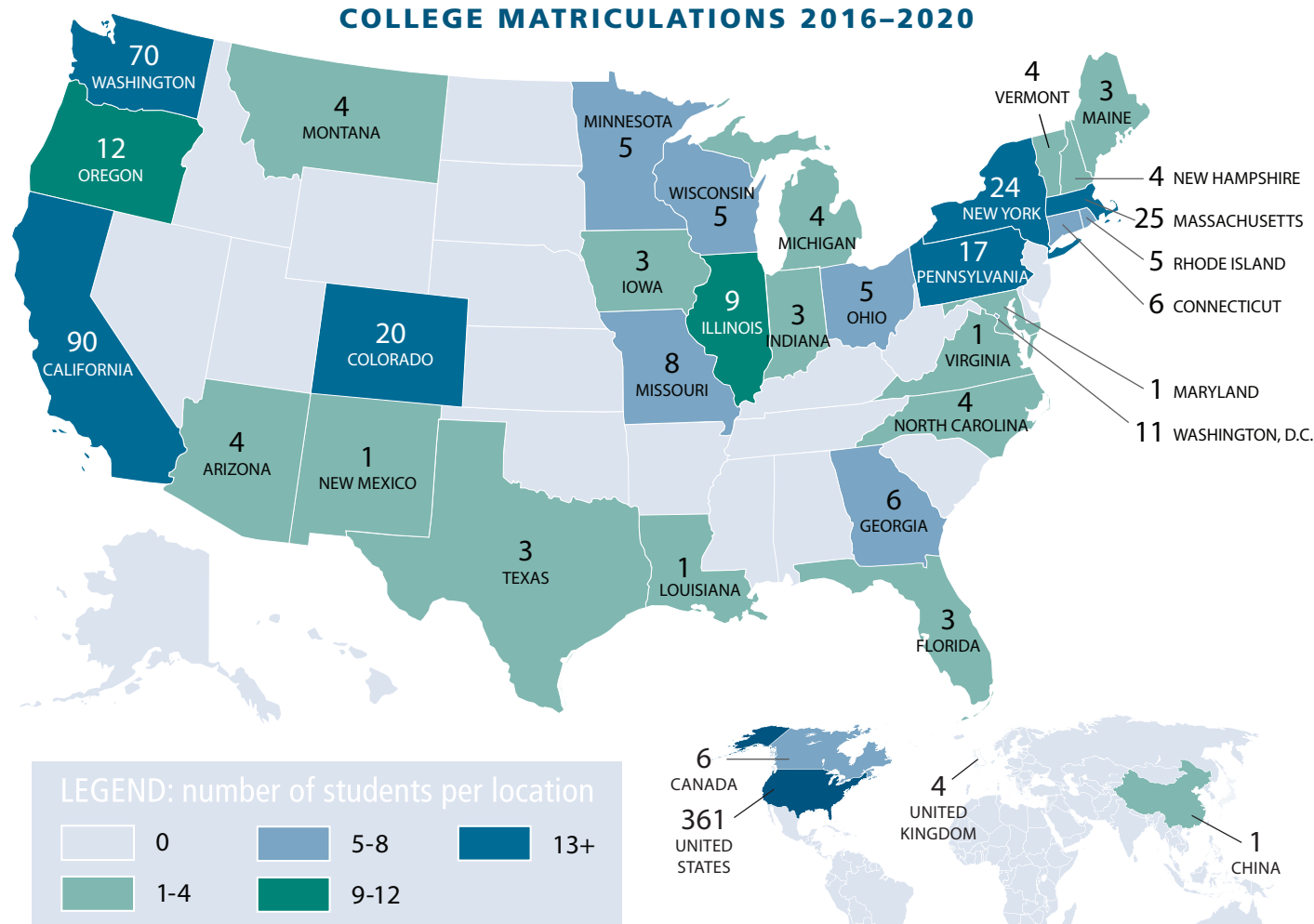
ENROLLMENT BY GEOGRAPHIC REGION 2020

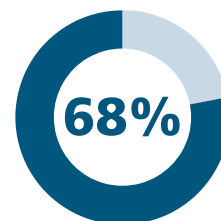
